

FAREWELL TO OUR DEAR UNCLE RALPH LAWRENCE

Camp Billings' favorite uncle, Uncle Ralph, passed away peacefully on February 19, 2009. Larry Drew tells us that at the final stage of Ralph's hospitalization he elected to follow the natural course of things – he chose to forego further intrusive life support provisions, talked with a minister, and was then composed and resting peacefully when he passed away.



With Ralph's passing, so too passes the second generation of Camp Billings leadership. Dad and Mother Hurd created the camp, building it from scratch from 1906 through 1957, a span of 52 years. Ralph started on the staff in 1950, then served as the camp director from 1958 to 1995, and finally remained active on the camp's board of directors until his death – a continuous span of 60 years. The wonderfully nurturing traditions and close family feelings at Camp Billings were due initially to the spirit of the camp that Dad and Mother Hurd created. Uncle Ralph then sustained and increased these traditions by his uniquely caring personality and his devotion to the camp, its campers, and its staff over many decades. Our task on the board of directors is now to perpetuate, foster and enhance these traditions for the benefit of the future generations of campers.

The funeral service for Ralph on February 28, 2009, at the Bradford VT Congregational Church was attended by well over two hundred people - Ralph's friends from Bradford as well as many members of the Camp Billings family from the U.S. and Canada. The social hour after the service went from noon well into mid-afternoon – you know what it's like when members of the Billings family get together. We know that many of you couldn't attend the funeral on short notice but do want to celebrate and honor Uncle Ralph's life and his contributions to your life. We will hold a special ceremony at camp early this summer to remember and pay tribute to the gifts of nurture, development and friendship that Ralph made to thousands of us during the 60 years he served Camp Billings. We will also be creating a special fund to celebrate Ralph's career at Camp Billings, and expect to devote it to the camp's crafts and arts programs that were so close to Ralph's heart.

I expect all of you will join me in a deep, personal gratitude that Ralph Lawrence was a part of our lives. He truly exemplifies the spirit of Camp Billings.

The passing of Ralph Lawrence is a huge loss for the Billings family. Generations of campers and staff were welcomed back to Billings year after year by Uncle Ralph, who offered them guidance and direction. His memory was outstanding, and there were few people he did not remember, even years later. Many remained in contact with him since their camp days. I want to thank all of you who have shared thoughts and memories online with your camp friends over the past few months.

I would like to invite you all to come back to Billings on Saturday, June 20th for a celebration of Uncle Ralph's life. We hope to make it a day for shared memories of our friend, mentor, past director, and board member. Some of you may be thinking that such things are of a trivial nature, but I assure you, Larry's advice continues to provide me, and many others, with such direction that I would surely be lost without him.






Where would any of us be if we did not know Uncle Larry's philosophy of life (and sports)..."be a good sport, give it your best shot, and have fun trying"?
