Greetings from the Board....

Bobby Green retires from Camp Billings. A History of the past 18 Great Years.....




Bobby was my counselor in Cabin 15 back in 1974 and when he became director 27 years later I wasn't all that surprised. His love and enthusiasm for camp back then, as it is now, hasn't changed. He was the perfect pick. He brought this love for camp coupled with his management and leadership skills developed from his years running a large company of radio stations and this combination has successfully put Camp Billings on top as one of the best camps in New England.

Bobby was a camper from 1966 - 1977. He was a member of the Board of Directors from 1984 - 1999, became the Director In Training in 2000, and has spent the last 18 years as Director from 2001 - 2018. Add all these years up and Bobby has spent a whopping 47 years at our Dear Ole Camp. Bobby has attributed much of his success to our ability to work TOGETHER, with the Board of Directors, and a tremendous continuity of Staff that he has been able to cultivate during his tenure. I would say the biggest part of what made Bobby a great Director was his philosophy of keeping camp FUN and making the overall environment where EVERYONE is accepted! This is why camp has remained full year after year. Here are some of the highlights over the last 18 years.

STAFF CONTINUITY

One of the most important success stories we have had is our ability for Staff Continuity. They love our Fine Dining Evening at Chez Larry, The Staff Softball game, making our Pre-Camp Video and the Tee Shirts unveiling. By the end of Pre-Camp, at least 20 of our Senior Counselors are Red Cross certified lifeguards and our entire staff is trained in First Aid and CPR. There has been no greater tool for recruiting our Sr Staff than our CIT Program and we have had only 2 CIT Directors over the past 16 years as well as only two Maintenance Directors, One Waterfront Director and our Nurse In Training Program (NIT) has solved the problem of the ever hard to fill Full Time Nurse position. We have also had the luxury of a decade of continuity in the Kitchen. In 2001 our menu consisted of mostly fried or pre-cooked foods: we had 2 cooks. Today we have 4 cooks and a menu that consists primarily of locally purchased fruits and vegetables, a salad bar, and nothing fried or pre-processed. Food at Camp Billings is now one of our greatest assets.





PROGRAM AREA IMPROVEMENTS

Beginning with our Craft Shop expansion and Pottery Studio, to our new Ropes Course, new Pontoon Boat and new Waterski Boat, an entire new fleet of Sailboats, new Rowboats, a dozen new stand up paddle boards and an expanded Fishing and Water Sports Program. We also schedule Daily Trips Out of Camp. We have Evening Program Specialists and Signature Special Events. Session 1: Hunger Games and 4th of July Celebration. Session 2: Billings Idol or Billings Glee and International Night. Session 3: The Musical. Session 4: Halloween and Country Fair. A major upgrade to our Lights and Sound Systems in Dartt Hall and the Dining Room which makes the signature Barry Manilow Night the best 1st Wednesday ever!


INFRASTRUCTURE & TECHNOLOGY IMPROVEMENTS

We constructed 3 new cabins, Cabin 1A, AnnieX, and Lucky 13 which allowed for the elimination of the tents and brought back the lake view and Country Club Lawn for our Sr. Girls. We also spun Cabin 1 around and added a beautiful front porch. Annex Lodge is also back on campus again! We renovated Sunnyside, the Guest House and Weownit and have started renting these cottages out in the off season, the profits of which help fund all of these improvements to our Program Areas. We purchased Kozy Nook, and will renovate that as well as Pinewold. We have all new toilets and shower facilities for the entire camp and all new sewer and water lines. We have also made major improvements to our phone and internet, and our new Website provides us with an exceptional new marketing tool and reconnects our valued Billings Alumni community.



BOARD OF DIRECTORS

I am very proud to work with such an amazing group of talented Board members we have here at Billings, some who have been here for over 25 years! It's important for a Board to communicate well with its Director, and to this point I want to thank Bobby for ALWAYS answering my emails and phone calls within 24 hours over the past 8 years while I've been President. Bobby is now passing the torch to our new Directors, Sean and Anne Collins and I know they will strive to become the type of Director that Bobby was which will ensure that Camp Billings will remain one of the BEST camps in New England for generations to come. 
