So many of these moments look similar across generations of Billings alumni, and honing in on those moments was a valuable exercise for the Board of Directors as we put pen to paper on what truly makes Billings special. When I think about some of my absolute favorite moments at camp, so many



of them took place during meal time when our entire community was together. To me, the dining hall is the absolute centerpiece of the Camp Billings experience across so many generations of alumni.


Favorite program area?

Brooks: I would say breakfast. I was a super picky eater so it was the one meal I knew there would be something I liked! **Tess:** Dinner




